Elizabeth Cottrill, MD, Associate Professor, joined the faculty in 2017, serves as Associate Program Director of the Residency program and Co-Director of the Jefferson Thyroid and Parathyroid Center. Rebecca Chiffer, MD, Assistant Professor and Associate Director of Medical Student Education in the department, joined the faculty in 2019. Elina Toskala, MD, PhD, MBA, Professor and Chair of the Department's

Faculty Affairs and Promotions Committee, joined the department's faculty in 2019.

Seeing the benefit of diversified female mentors for residents, fellows and new attendings, our faculty organized the first Philadelphia-wide Women in Otolaryngology meeting in 2018. Spotlight on Research: Hope for Anosmia Patients

Over 25% of Americans above the age of 50 suffer from olfactory disturbances and the COVID pandemic has been adding to this number. Over the years, various therapies have been attempted for the treatment of anosmia with inconsistent results. Platelet-rich plasma (PrP), owing to the presence of multiple concentrated growth factors, is reported to improve tissue healing and regeneration in the musculoskeletal and peripheral nervous systems. David Rosen, MD, who has been at the forefront of olfactory research, designed a clinical trial to elucidate if PrP can help improve olfactory outcomes in patients with anosmia

and olfactory disturbance. The trial, which has been active for just over one year has already completed enrollment of 30 patients. Each patient can receive up to 10 treatments in 4-week intervals, in an office visit that lasts approximately one hour. PrP is extracted at every visit and endoscopically placed close to the olfactory mucosa. Scratch-and-sniff smell tests are used to gauge response to treatment at each visit. Most patients reported a subjective improvement in their sense of smell over their treatment course with 44% of patients showing an objective improvement of more than three points on the brief smell identification test

after three visits. One of our patients who was anosmic for two years recently completed her visits and has made a remarkable recovery. Initially, only being able to identify 3 out of the 12 odorants in her smell test, she is currently able to identify 11 out of 12 odorants and is grateful that she can smell her food again! PrP is turning out to be a ray of hope for patients who have tried almost everything to get their sense of smell back. We are thankful to our department and donors for making this study available to them.

Anne Kane, MD (HNF '20) was recently awarded the Triological Society Career Development Award to be funded in the amount of \$40,000 over years. Dr. Kane's proposal is entitled "Education of Primary Care Providers in order to Improve Rates of Early Presentation and Organ Preservation in Laryngeal Cancer Patients in Mississippi." Mississippi has the 4th highest incidence of laryngeal cancer in

the US, with a large proportion being advanced stage at presentation. Dr. Kane hopes to increase early patient presentation through education of referring providers.

Earlier this year, James Daniero, MD (R '92) and his colleague at the University of Virginia, Donald Griffin, MD (Biomedical Engineering) were awarded an NIH R-21 (Exploratory/Developmental Research Grant) from the National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases (NIAMS) to develop a microporous hydrogel that adheres to areas of mucosal injury, accelerates wound healing, and reduces scar formation. Although this biomucosal sealant is broadly applicable to all forms of natural orifice transluminal endoscopic surgery (NOTES), the specific application of this technology is designed to treat acute laryngeal injury and prevent the development of posterior glottic stenosis. Given the surge of intubation-associated laryngeal injuries resulting from the SARS-CoV2 pandemic, the impact of this research has risen significantly. During the first year of this 2-year project, a rabbit model of laryngeal injury was developed, and in vitro optimization of mucosal adhesive properties is ongoing. In 2022 a randomized animal model trial of (1) base hydrogel, (2) mucosal adherent hydrogel, and (3) saline will be conducted to demonstrate wound retention and anti-fibrotic properties. Following completion of the proof-of-concept study, the final version of the biomucosal sealant will be commercialized for endoscopic wound healing across many applications, including laryngeal from COVID-19.

David's Dream and Believe Cancer Foundation




