Dr. Lauriello is the Daniel Lieberman Professor and Chair of the Department of Psychiatry and Human Behavior, as well as Senior Vice President of Behavioral Health at Jefferson.

Prior to joining our faculty in 2019, Dr. Lauriello served as Chair of the University of Missouri Department of Psychiatry for 10 years. During that time, he oversaw a major expansion of the department, including the opening of the University of Missouri Psychiatric Center. Formerly an acute care state facility, the center is now widely regarded as the Psychiatric Center of Excellence for the Mid-Missouri region.

Dr. Lauriello is an active expert and investigator in the area of diagnosis and treatment of schizophrenia. He is an author/co-author of over 100 publications and is a frequent presenter at national meetings. He was the recipient of the 2011 Drs. M. Page and Henry Laughlin Alumnus of the Year Award, the highest alumni honor presented by the Temple University School of Medicine and has been voted one of the Best Doctors in America® from 1998 to 2018. He was elected to the America College of Psychiatrists in 2014, the American Psychiatric Association Distinguished Fellowship in 2018, and was the 2019 Missouri Psychiatric Physicians Association (MPAA) President until leaving for Jefferson. He has been selected one of the Best Doctors in America® from 1998 to 2020

A graduate of Yale University in New Haven, CT, Dr. Lauriello completed medical school at Temple University in Philadelphia and residency at New York Presbyterian Hospital's Payne Whitney Psychiatric Clinic. He completed fellowships focused on psychopharmacology and psychobiology at the University of California, San Diego and Stanford University.
